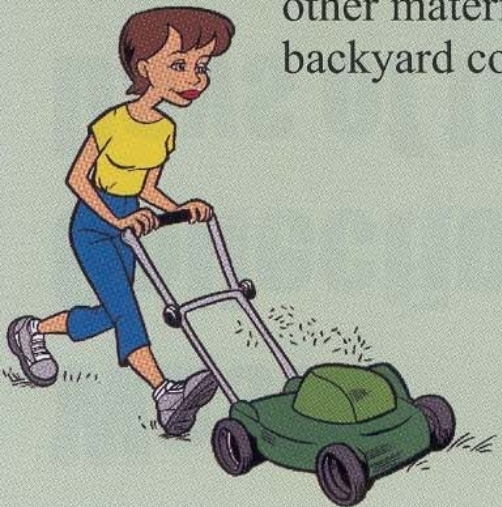
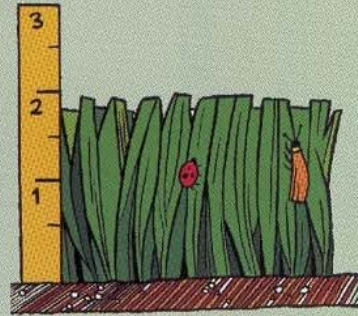


Grasscycling

Leave those Grass Clippings on the lawn

For best results, follow these tips:

- Mow when the grass is dry.
- Cut grass to its ideal height of 2 to 3 inches.
- Don't let the grass get too long between cuttings! Only 1/3 of the grass height should be removed with each mowing.
- Don't overwater! Your lawn needs about one inch of water per week. Early morning watering is best.
- Small amounts of clippings can be used in your garden as fertilizer, or mixed with other materials in your backyard composter.

Backyard Composting

Backyard composting is easy. Just follow these simple steps.

- Cut all materials into small pieces.
- Add kitchen wastes and yard wastes in layers.
- Keep the pile moist.



- Turn your compost pile regularly.
- Add small amounts of grass clippings to your composter.
- Harvest the finished compost.
